



# **Unable to Power on Issue**

### 1. Confirm connections are secure to the EnVR, UPS/Surge Protector, and wall outlet. The following cable connections should be checked:

- EnVR power cable to the UPS/Surge Protector
- UPS power cable to the wall outlet
- Let the help desk know if it was connected into a wall outlet instead of a ups

#### 2. Confirm the outlet or power source is providing power, connect a different device like a phone charger. If the power issue is:

- The UPS > Connect ENVR to both the battery back up and surge only sides and bypass if needed
- The Surge Protector -> Try a different outlet and determine if it needs to be replaced.
- The wall outlet -> Find an alternate power source (wall outlet) to connect the UPS/Surge Protector. The manager will have to contact their facilities manager or electrician for a bad wall outlet
- The EnVR power cable -> Re-seat

## **Flashing or Flickering Power Button/LCD**

#### EnVR will not power on when pressing the power button, but the power button light or LCD display (if applicable) flashes or flickers several times.

Safely open the EnVR case.

- 1. Have the tech disconnect the power cable, then open the EnVR chassis and locate the DIMM (RAM module) port near the CPU fan.
- 2. Inspect the RAM module to see if they appear to be improperly seated or loose.
- 3. Carefully re-seat each RAM module:
- 4. Depress the tabs on both sides of the DIMM ports to unlock the RAM.
- 5. Carefully pull the RAM out of the DIMM port, making sure not to touch the gold contacts along the bottom of the RAM module.
- 6. Inspect the gold contacts for any clear and obvious signs of damage (burns, breaks, etc.) Faint scratches and slight discoloration may be present, this is normal.
- 7. Place the RAM module in the DIMM port, aligning the gap along the bottom of the RAM module with it's matched position in the DIMM port.
- Carefully and firmly press the top of the RAM module on both sides.
  The tabs on the outside of the DIMM ports should lock into place with an audible "click".
- 9. Connect the power cable and power on the EnVR. Relay information with the help desk.









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
